The Gardeners of America's national convention will be held at the Wooster campus of The Ohio State University's campus of the Agricultural Technical Institute September 12-14. 

SPEAKER BIOS:

TERRY LANKER: Terry holds the title of Faculty Emeritus from The Ohio State University. She recently retired from her position as Coordinator of the Floral Design and Marketing program at Ohio State ATI and served as Chair of the ATI Horticulture Division for 15 years. Terry's expertise includes the art of floral design as well as the science of post-harvest flower care and the business of retail floristry. She is the recipient of several teaching and service awards including being named Teacher of the Year by the Ohio Association of Two-Year Colleges. Terry is a member of the Smithers-Oasis Ambassador's Team and has authored several books including Flower Arranging published in 2020 by Wildflower Media. She has also written a monthly column in Florists' Review, presented floral design seminars and handson workshops throughout the US, and has served as a member of the Teleflora Educational Design team.

JIM CHATFIELD: Jim is an Associate Professor and Extension Specialist at OSU's ATI. He has a B.S in Botany from the Ohio University and a M.S in Plant Pathology from the Ohio State University. He worked from 1980 - 1982 on his PhD program in the Plant Pathology Department at OSU; completed course work and general examniation. Jim has held extensive green industry Extension workshops thoughout the United States, especially in Ohio and the Midwest. The workshops include plant problem diagnostics, plant materials, plant selection and plant pathology topics.

EDGAR STEHLI: Edgar's interest in orchids began when he was just six or seven years old. Edgar found a plant growing in the roadside ditch near our house in Northeast Ohio. When his father got home from work, he dragged him over to see his discovery. He said "Oh! That's an orchid." His first orchid find was a Spiranthes (probably cernua). A few years later his family drove to Alaska and back. On that trip, he found a Calypso bulbosa in Wyoming and several other orchids in Alaska and Canada. While in high school, Edgar began growing some tropical orchids, and soon had a small collection. While in his final year at Case Western Reserve University, his orchid collection moved to Florida with my parents. Sadly, he never saw them again (the orchids that is!). Also in his last year, Edgar met Kim Sante who was working at the Cleveland Garden Center, now known as the Cleveland Botanical Gardens. Eventually Kim and Edgar were married in Kenya, Africa. Shortly after they were married, they built a sunroom on the corner of their house. This of course allowed Edgar's orchid collection to get a little out of hand. Finally in 1999 they began selling their plants to area florists, then through the orchid shows. They called their business - Windswept in Time Orchids. They now attend close to fifteen shows a year, where their plants and exhibits have won many awards.

SPEAKER BIOS:

LAURA DEETER: Laura Deeter received her PhD in horticulture from The Ohio State University after studying road-salt tolerance in herbaceous perennials under Dr. Steve Still. She is currently a Professor of Horticulture at The Ohio State University in Horticulture and Crop Science and the Sandy and Andy Ross Endowed Director of the Chadwick Arboretum. She has taught a multitude of horticulture classes including: Woody and Herbaceous Plant Identification, Landscape Design, Sustainable Landscaping, Plant Health Management, Landscape Construction, and Ecology, to name a few. She was awarded the ATI Distinguished Teaching Award three times, the OSU Alumni Award for Distinguished Teaching, the Perennial Plant Association Teaching Award the American Horticulture Society Teaching Award, Perennial Plant Association Service Award, a Lifetime Achievement Award from the Ohio Landscape Association and Professor of the Year from Instructure. She travels extensively speaking on a variety of topics ranging from taxonomy and nomenclature to shade gardens, design, color, and specialty gardens and plants. Her new home is an open canvas for spring planting with 3 large dogs!

MARK YODERS: Mark graduated cum laude with a Nursery Management degree from OSU's Agricultural Technical Institute. As the nursery/horticulture technician at ATI, Mark became a certified arborist through the International Society of Arboriculture and maintained that certification for 25 of those 30 years. Part of his job responsibilities included assisting various faculty in teaching the arboriculture classes as well as maintaining the trees and grounds on ATI's campus. After 30 years of dedicated service, he retired from OSU/ATI. Upon leaving, he worked for six years with the Wayne County Public Library as a CDL bookmobile driver and retired completely three years ago.

Mark married his high school sweetheart, and they will be celebrating their 47th their anniversary in early October. They have four children and five beautiful grandchildren. Mark looks forward to be sharing my bonsai knowledge and experience with the participants of the hands-on workshop where they will create, design and take home their personal, hardy bonsai.
